Chairman of Physical Research Laboratory Management Council and Member, Space Commission, Govt. of India.



• "Overview of the Power System of Bangladesh – Current Status and Issues" – July 28, 2022 (Auditorium, AIUB). Organized by the Faculty of Engineering, this technical talk by Prof. Dr. Muhammad Riazul Hamid (a multi-sector consultant) discussed Bangladesh's energy and power infrastructure. Faculty and students from across AIUB attended, with Q&A following the lecture.

AIUB holds seminar on Bangladesh's power system



American International University-Bangladesh (AIUB) organised an informative technical talk titled 'Overview of the Power System of Bangladesh-Current Status and Issues' as a part of "Dr Anwarul Abedin Lecture Series" on 28 July.

The seminar was organised by the Faculty of Engineering (FE) in the honour of AIUB's visionary Founder Chairman Dr Anwarul Abedin who catalysed substantial transformation in the educational sector of the country, reads a press release.

Prof Dr Muhammad Riazul Hamid, Multi-sector Consultant was the esteemed guest speaker for the occasion.

The talk was on the overview, status, and issues regarding the power system of Bangladesh.

Prof Hamid began his presentation by talking about Bangladesh's main energy sources and power generation over the past 13 years. He also explained system loss, technical and non-technical loss, installed capacity rate, and per capita generation.

The speaker also covered the causes and challenges regarding geopolitical products such as coal and liquid natural gas, and potential solutions associated with the current load shedding. Afterwards, a short interactive discussion session was held where the speakers answered the queries of the participants. Following that, Prof Dr Md Abdul Mannan, Director, Faculty of Engineering, AIUB thanked the speaker and presented a token of appreciation to the speaker.

• "Be a Future-Fit Leader" – Nov 14, 2022 (AIUB Campus). Hosted by the Dept. of Marketing, Faculty of Business Administration (FBA), this seminar featured Mr. Solaiman Alam (Chief Digital & Strategy Officer of Grameenphone) as keynote speaker <u>aiub.edu</u>. It addressed leadership in the era of the 4th Industrial Revolution, and was attended by AIUB students, faculty, and invited guests <u>aiub.edu</u>.

Seminar on "Be a Future-Fit Leader" - Dr. Anwarul Abedin's Lecture Series



The Department of Marketing, Faculty of Business Administration (FBA), American International University-Bangladesh (AIUB), organized a seminar under the Dr. Anwarul Abedin's Lecture Series titled "Be a Future Fit Leader" on November 14, 2022.

The program started with the inauguration speech delivered by Prof. Dr. Nisar Ahmed, Director, MBA Program where he addressed the significance of Future Leadership. He also mentioned the top strategic technology trends that must be followed to be an effective leader in the future. The speaker introduced Grameen Phone and its operations in Bangladesh from a strategic perspective. Mr. Alam provided a comprehensive overview of the various strategic leadership practices. He suggested that participants not think from a business perspective but think from the customers' point of view and focus on innovation in every aspect. Mr. Roomee Tareque Moudud, Director, Office of Placement and Alumni, delivered the Vote of Thanks. Associate Deans, Directors, Heads, and faculty members of different departments, key officials, and students of different programs also attended and enjoyed the event.

Dr Anwarul Abedin lecture series on secrets to success held at AIUB



The Faculty of Engineering (FE) of American International University – Bangladesh(AIUB) organized a seminar titled Secrets to Success included in the prestigious Dr Anwarul Abedin Lecture Series on Thursday.

The speaker of the seminar is Zaheed Sabur, senior director, at Google, and an alumnus of the Department of Computer Engineering (CoE), AIUB.

This seminar started at 3:30pm and ended at 5pm in AIUB Auditorium.

The auditorium was houseful, and the session was interactive due to the presence of educators and many learners from every discipline.

The session was inaugurated by the chief guest of the event Mr Ishtiaque Abedin, founder member and chairman, the Board of Trustees, AIUB and he welcomed the speaker to the stage to give his invaluable speech and greeted Sabur's companions at the session.

The speaker, Zaheed Sabur, started his speech by introducing his current work going on with application of long data and generative AI.

The speaker spoke on his early academic undergraduate years at AIUB, as well as his career hardships, beginning with his position as a software engineer at Google's backend system development project in 2007 in India's Bangalore office and continuing six months later in their California office.

Sabur also led the engineering team for the first Google Assistant Smart Displays.

He emphasized the importance of learning through understanding rather than memorization.

The speaker recommended balancing life planning priorities in the past, present, and future while successfully organizing time.

The speaker concluded the talk by emphasizing the value of being kind and respectful, sharing knowledge to improve oneself, and being appreciative of what everyone has in life.

Afterward, during an interactive question and answer session, Sabur discussed his previous temporary failures and how he overcame them, his constraints before becoming successful, how to present work positions would be affected by technology, and the benefits and drawbacks of ever-evolving AI modules.

He expressed his views on the need for clear basic mathematical ideas and programming language in engineering professional positions.


Then, Prof Dr ABM Siddique Hossain, dean, FE, AIUB emphasized that by working hard, one can fulfill one's life goals.

• Health and Social Awareness Seminars:

AIUB has also opened its campus for seminars addressing public health and social issues, often in partnership with external organizations:

"Empowering Women Through Reproductive Healthcare" – Nov 11, 2025 (AIUB Campus). A seminar jointly organized by AIUB's Institutional Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and Office of Student Affairs, in collaboration with healthcare partners, to raise awareness about women's reproductive health and break related taboos. Aimed primarily at young women, the event featured medical experts discussing vital health issues and encouraged open dialogue among attendees (mostly students and some outside participants).

AIUB Hosts Seminar on "Empowering Women Through Reproductive Healthcare" to Raise Awareness and Break Taboos



A seminar titled "Empowering Women Through Reproductive Healthcare" was organized by AIUB's Institutional Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and the AIUB Women Forum in collaboration with Marie Stopes Bangladesh (MSB) on November 5, at the Media Studio (Annex 2). The initiative aimed to promote awareness among female students about vital reproductive health issues and to encourage open dialogue on topics often considered sensitive in society. The seminar was supported by the Office of Student Affairs (OSA), AIUB.

The session began with an inspiring opening speech by Prof. Dr. Saiful Islam, Honorable Vice Chancellor of AIUB, who emphasized the importance of creating an informed, confident, and health-conscious generation of young women. He highlighted AIUB's ongoing commitment to providing platforms that empower students through education and open discussion.

Dr. Sumona Ferdous, General Manager of Clinical Quality Assurance & Management at Marie Stopes Bangladesh, delivered an insightful presentation on key reproductive health topics such as cervical cancer prevention, sexually transmissible infections (STIs), PCOS, and the importance of nutrition and regular health checkups. Following her, Dr. Surayea Bulbul, Consultant at Marie Stopes Maternity Clinic, Dhanmondi, spoke about menstruation and menstrual hygiene, focusing on debunking myths and promoting healthy, informed practices.

The seminar offered a highly interactive learning environment. During the question-andanswer segment, students actively participated and felt encouraged to speak freely. Many broke long-held social taboos by raising personal health queries, demonstrating the significance of creating confidential and supportive platforms where women can discuss their wellbeing without hesitation or judgement.

The event drew an all-female audience, ensuring a comfortable and relatable atmosphere. Participants expressed that the session was timely, informative, and deeply needed, as it addressed areas of women's health that are often overlooked or misunderstood. Light refreshments for participants were graciously sponsored by ACI.

AIUB is also pleased to share that discussions are underway to establish a formal Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Marie Stopes Bangladesh. Under this initiative, AIUB students and staff will have access to selected reproductive healthcare services at discounted rates, further strengthening the university's commitment to student wellbeing.

At the conclusion of the seminar, tokens of appreciation were exchanged with the resource persons. The success of the program was made possible through the dedicated efforts and cooperation of the AIUB management and administrative staff, whose support ensured the smooth and meaningful execution of this important event.

 Cervical Cancer Awareness Program – Dec 29, 2024 (AIUB Multipurpose Hall). Organized by AIUB IQAC, OSA, and AIUB Women Forum in partnership with Popular Pharmaceuticals PLC, this program educated participants on cervical cancer prevention and provided on-site HPV vaccinations. The AIUB Social Welfare Club "Shomoy" mobilized a week-long campus campaign beforehand, registering students and ensuring broad participation. The event included expert talks by a pharmaceutical medical director and AIUB's Public Health faculty, and was an example of the university's commitment to community health outreach.

Cervical Cancer Awareness Program at AIUB



On Sunday, December 29, 2024, the Institutional Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Office of Student Affairs (OSA), and AIUB Women Forum, in collaboration with Popular Pharmaceuticals PLC, successfully organized the Cervical Cancer Awareness Program at the AIUB Multipurpose Hall (Building D). This impactful initiative, facilitated by the AIUB Social Welfare Club – Shomoy, aimed to educate students about cervical cancer risks and prevention strategies while offering on-site vaccination services to registered participants.

In the lead-up to the event, the AIUB Shomoy Club played a pivotal role by setting up an awareness stall on campus for a week. They ran a vaccination campaign and gathered information from interested students, ensuring broad participation and outreach.

The program commenced with a warm welcome and an opening speech by Professor Dr. Md. Abdur Rahman, Pro-Vice Chancellor of AIUB. Distinguished guests included Professor Dr. Saiful Islam, Honorable Vice-Chancellor of AIUB, representatives from Popular Pharmaceuticals PLC, faculty members, and students.

A key highlight was an insightful presentation by Dr. Zayer Rashid, Head of the Medical Service Department at Popular Pharmaceuticals PLC, who addressed the current state and future challenges of cervical cancer in Bangladesh and highlighted the benefits of vaccination. This was followed by a compelling discussion led by Professor Dr. Muhammad Wasif Alam, Head of the Department of Public Health at AIUB, who emphasized the critical need for community awareness and preventive measures to combat cervical cancer.

The program concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by Mr. Kazi Abdul Mubin, Brand Manager of Popular Pharmaceuticals PLC. In his closing remarks, Professor Dr. Saiful Islam, Honorable Vice-Chancellor of AIUB, underscored the university's commitment to health

• Space Robotics Workshops:

Ospace Robotics Workshop – Oct 22, 2022 (AIUB Campus). AIUB hosted a hands-on "Space Robotics Workshop" organized by the Bangladesh Innovation Forum and Space Innovation Camp. The event welcomed 100 children (ages 4–16) from various schools to build simple robots with mentorship. Participants were grouped and guided by mentors to assemble robots, then demonstrated their creations to guests. A former NASA systems administrator attended as chief guest, inspiring the kids to pursue science and technology. AIUB engineering faculty supported the workshop and thanked the organizers for using the campus to "sow the seed of science and technology in young minds".

AIUB Hosted Space Robotics Workshop

On October 22, 2022, the American International University-Bangladesh (AIUB) hosted an exceptional workshop titled "'Space Robotics Workshop" which was organized by the Bangladesh Innovation Forum and Space Innovation Camp. 100 children aged between 4 to 16 years from different schools participated in this event.

Bangladesh Innovation Forum President Mr. Ariful Hasan Apu welcomed all the participants and guests. He said, in this workshop, children will be shown the various activities of space robotics and also through this workshop they will learn teamwork and develop problem solving skills. The workshop started at 2 PM where all the participants gained hand on experience on how to make robots by themselves with the assistance of mentors. All children were divided into small groups led by mentor. Later they demonstrated the robot they made by themselves in front of the guests. Mr. Azadul Haque, the former system administrator of NASA, was present as the chief guest in the program. He said that the robotics workshop being held by these children today is sowing a seed of science and technology in the minds of the children. The results will start coming in 10 to 15 years by starting today. Professor Dr. Md. Abdur Rahman (Associated Dean, Faculty of Engineering, AIUB & Adviser, Bangladesh Innovation Forum) thanked Bangladesh Innovation Forum and Space Innovation Camp for organizing this innovative event at AIUB. He also thanked the guardians for encouraging their children to participate in this event.



o Space Robotics Camp – Sept 29–30, 2023 (AIUB Campus). South Asia's largest space-themed robotics camp was co-organized by Bangladesh Innovation Forum and Space Innovation Camp, with AIUB as the venue partner. Over 200 children from across Bangladesh (ages 4–16) participated in this two-day camp, forming 30 teams that each built a functional robot with a space mission theme. The robots performed tasks like collecting space debris and detecting gases (simulating Mars exploration). AIUB's Pro-Vice Chancellor inaugurated the camp, emphasizing the value of igniting scientific curiosity at an early age to propel the nation's future. The camp engaged parents and school communities as well, illustrating AIUB's outreach in STEM education.

AIUB Hosted Space Robotics Camp

The South Asia's largest "Space Robotics Camp", was organized by the Bangladesh Innovation Forum and Space Innovation Camp on September 29-30, 2023, hosted at the American International University-Bangladesh (AIUB). This two-day event drew the participation of 200 students, aged 4-16, from various regions of Bangladesh. These young enthusiasts were divided into 30 groups, collectively undertaking the task of constructing approximately 30 robots, all centered around a space-themed design.

These robots were designed to perform a wide array of scientific experiments, with a particular focus on Mars and Chad. Their capabilities include functioning as space junk collectors, detecting carbon monoxide, oxygen, and methane, among other essential features.

The event featured Prof. Dr. Md. Abdur Rahman, the Pro Vice-Chancellor of American International University-Bangladesh, as the chief guest. He emphasized the significance of initiating education in early childhood through such activities. He highlighted how nurturing young talents from an early age can set the stage for propelling the nation forward in the future.

Mr. Ariful Hasan Opu, President of Bangladesh Innovation Forum and Crew Chief of Space Innovation Camp underscored the importance of captivating children's imaginations with stories of adventure, curiosity, and scientific discovery. He noted that such narratives serve not only as a source of fascination for children but also as valuable educational experiences. These stories allow children to explore the wonders of the universe and acquire essential problem-solving skills.

The American International University-Bangladesh (AIUB) was the venue partner for this event, with Creative Junior acting as the knowledge partner.

On February 8, 2025, Space Innovation Camp successfully organized Kids Space Camp 2025 to inspire children and teenagers in space science. This day-long Space Camp was held at Multipurpose Hall, Annex-7, American International University-Bangladesh (AIUB), where young participants from 85 schools across Bangladesh took part. Through unique activities

With the guidance of experienced Mission Controllers, children and teenagers learned model rocket building and launching, space robot creation and programming, telescope making and space observation, as well as designing colonies for Mars and the Moon. The camp also featured VR-based astronaut training, offering immersive space experience. Additionally, a team of young participants not only designed a Mars colony but also published their own research paper, showcasing their innovative ideas and scientific curiosity. The event was graced by the presence of the Chief Guest, Dr. Hasanul A Hasan (Founder Member and Vice Chairman, Board of Trustees, AIUB). He mentioned that the activities undertaken by the young participants would further stimulate their creativity and curiosity. He also stated events like this would be instrumental in shaping Bangladesh's future scientists, engineers, and space researchers. The event was also graced by the presence of Special Guest, Mr. James Gardiner (Economic Officer, U.S. Department of State). He stated Space Innovation Camp has created a platform where children and teenagers can start dreaming about space science from an early age. He also mentioned today's children are the scientists, researchers, and astronauts of tomorrow. The President of Space Innovation Camp, Mr. Ariful Hasan Opu said their goal is to continue bringing new initiatives for children and teenagers in the future, enabling them to learn, explore, and turn their dreams into reality. In the closing remark Prof. Dr. Saiful Islam (Vice Chancellor, AIUB) mentioned through this kind of program, kids and adolescents can learn new things that will accelerate their academic activities. He highlighted how nurturing young talents from an early age can set the stage for propelling the nation forward in the future. The event was also graced by the presence of Dr. Carmen Z. Lamagna (Member, Board of Trustees, AIUB), Prof. Dr. Md. Abdur Rahman (Pro-Vice Chancellor, AIUB) and many other officials of AIUB.

• Science Olympiads and Fairs:

Auditorium). AIUB hosted the national grand finale – Apr 27, 2024 (AIUB Auditorium). AIUB hosted the national grand finale of the Space Exploration Olympiad 2023 aiub.edu, a first-of-its-kind science competition in Bangladesh powered by ACI Pure Salt and organized by Bangladesh Innovation Forum and Space Innovation Camp aiub.edu. After months of regional rounds (including online exams, astronaut camps, and school campaigns in all eight divisions), 150 finalists (ages 6–14) from all over the country came to AIUB for the final exam aiub.edu. Winners and runners-up in three age categories were honored on-stage aiub.edu. The event drew government representatives (from the Prime Minister's Office) as chief guests and was co-organized by the National Museum of Science & Technology, with AIUB as academic partner aiub.edu. By hosting this Olympiad, AIUB provided a platform for young "small scientists" nationwide to explore space science and be celebrated for their talent aiub.edu.

AIUB Hosted Grand Finale of Space Exploration Olympiad



On April 27, 2024 AIUB hosted the Grand Finale of Space Exploration Olympiad. Space Exploration Olympiad powered by ACI Pure Salt was held for the first time in the country under the initiative of Bangladesh Innovation Forum and Space Innovation Camp. Students aged 6 to 9, 10 to 12 and 13 to 14 years participated in this Olympiad in three groups. Astronaut camps, 150 school campaigns, district-wise data boot camps have been held in eight divisions of the country based on the Olympiad. Apart from this, space scientists and researchers answered various questions about space to children through 12 space talks.

The final of Space Exploration Olympiad was held on April 27, 2024 with the selected students through two preliminary and secondary online exams according to their age. 150 crew members from all over the country participated in the final exam, 9 people from three groups got the Excellence Award including the runner-up, second runner-up and champion. For Category 6-9 Years the awardees are: The Champion was Nusaib Hasan Labib from CDA Public School And College, Chittagong, the Runner Up was Arham Md. Nusayer from SFX Greenherald International School, Dhaka and the 2nd Runner Up was Md. Safwan Hasan from Civil Aviation School and College, Dhaka. Category 10-12 years: Champion was Aminur Rahman

Sazim from N. Alam Merit Care School, Dhaka, Runner-Up was Subha Safayet Shizda from LORDS An English Medium School, Dhaka and the 2nd Runner Up was Md. Safwan Hasan from Civil Aviation School and College, Dhaka. Category 13-14 years: champion was Lidika Rahman from Birshreshtha Munshi Abdur Rouf public College, Dhaka. Runner-up was Wafiq Karim from Universal Tutorial, Dhaka and the 2nd runner-up was Adyan Omair Islam from Playpen School, Dhaka. Besides, the Excellence Award was given to Jadeeda Jawad Trana from Nawab Faizunnesa Govt Girls' High School, Cumilla.

Shahida Sultana (Executive Cell and PEPZ, Director General Prime Minister's Office) was present as the chief guest at the event. She said, - "Power to change the world in the hands of small scientists! They will take our country forward in the coming days. Program Chair Prof. Dr. Md. Abdur Rahman (Pro-Vice Chancellor, AIUB) mentioned through this kind of program, children and adolescents can learn new things that will accelerate their academic activities. Md. Jisan Rahman (Business Manager, ACI Limited) mentioned ACI has been working for a long time in the development of children's talent. The event was also attended by Mr. Ariful Hasan Opu (President of Bangladesh Innovation Forum) and Mohammad Mahdi Uz Zaman (Country Head of Space Exploration Olympiad USA). • Tech and Entrepreneurship Competitions:

Cisco IoT Hackathon 2024 – Nov 2, 2024 (AIUB Campus, D-Building). On November 2, 2024, the American International University-Bangladesh (AIUB) hosted the "Cisco IoT Hackathon 2024" in its campus at Kuratoli, Khilkhet, Dhaka. This day-long event brought together 125 talented programming teams from educational institutions across the country. From this remarkable pool of innovative minds, 20 teams advanced to the final competition round, where they presented their projects to a distinguished panel of judges.

Following a rigorous evaluation, the judges awarded prizes to the top three teams for their exceptional projects. The first prize of 50,000 BDT was awarded to Team Underrated—comprising Md. Shakil Hossain, Mahin Shikder, Kamrul Islam, and Safid Hasan—for their outstanding project, "Smart Farm Management System Using IoT for Enhanced Agricultural Productivity and Disaster Mitigation," which impressed the judges with its innovation and technical prowess. The second prize of 30,000 BDT went to Team Sohayok (Md. Rahat Al Mamun, Sujoy Mahmud, Samiul Haque, Md. Rayhan Hossain, Jotirmoy Mollick) for their project, "A Cost-Efficient Device for Individuals with Cerebral Palsy Utilizing IoT." The third prize of 20,000 BDT was awarded to Team Artificial Intelligence Bangladesh (Shahida Afrin, K.M. Farzadul Islam, Shoriful Islam Sumon, Sheikh Ashim Asman Azaz) for their impactful project, Interactive Educational Bot for Children using IoT.

The winners were selected based on creativity, innovation, and technical execution. The event concluded with an award ceremony, where Mrs. Nadia Anwar, Chairperson of the AIUB Board of Trustees, and Prof. Dr. Saiful Islam, Vice Chancellor of AIUB, presented the prizes to the winning teams. These entrepreneurs (including CEOs of local agritech and insure-tech startups) shared insights with an audience of AIUB business students and faculty. The event, moderated by the MIS department head, bridged academic knowledge with real-world entrepreneurship, and was aimed at inspiring both AIUB students and aspiring entrepreneurs in the community. The event was designed to bridge the gap between academic knowledge and real-world application, offering practical advice and motivation to the next generation of business leaders.

The core of the seminar centered on the personal and professional experiences of the esteemed panel members, who each offered unique and compelling narratives of their success. Mr. Tasvir A. Faheem, drawing from his winning journey at the Grameenphone Accelerator, shared how he and his team were able to secure significant national and international funding for their ventures. He emphasized a pragmatic approach, strongly advising aspiring entrepreneurs to work in a corporate or business organization for a few years before embarking on their own entrepreneurial journey. He provided the audience with a foundation of essential skills and a deeper understanding of market dynamics. Ms. Nurunnassa (Nasim) captivated the audience with her heartfelt account of being a female entrepreneur in Bangladesh's challenging yet rewarding ecosystem. She spoke candidly about the unique obstacles she overcame and the triumphs that followed, offering a message of resilience and empowerment. Mr. Sayed Zubaer

Hasan provided a deep dive into the critical concept of achieving product-market fit. He explained the iterative process of listening to customer feedback, adapting the product, and finding the right niche. He highlighted the vast opportunities that await students who possess the right skills, urging them to

proactively prepare for the demands of the modern startup world. Finally, Mr. Ashraf Hossain Sachin, an alumnus of FBA, AIUB, shared his personal journey with a "moonshot mentality" approach to entrepreneurship. Mr. Ashraf Hossain Sachin emphasized the significance of setting ambitious goals and embracing failure. He offered candid advice, detailing what future entrepreneurs should and should not expect. His guidance included a set of "dos and don'ts" and a "recipe for success," which resonated strongly with the students.
